I could never just sit behind a desk, eight hours a day, seven days a week, that's just not me.” When asked about current trends, Carrie says the “BOB” is the latest thing. “The Bob is huge right now,” she said. “Almost everyone can wear it.” She emphasizes that there's no “one size fits all” style for anyone. That's why she leaves it up to her clients to communicate to her what makes them feel

comfortable. “I can recommend something, but in the end, they're the ones who have to wear it, and I want them to be happy when they walk out the door.”

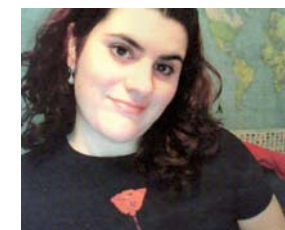
The Ardell lashes are not just for parties, weddings or an evening out. Individual lashes and even the strip or band styles are made for a subtle everyday look.
